#### What an US Alsace year 2015!

Only a two months away from the 145th birthday of L'Union Alsacienne (Feb 19, 2016), we can take stock with pride of a wonderful "US ALSACE year 2015". Within our 15

events organized this year to promote Alsace and L'UnAl, the Sept 19, 2015 Alsace Pride on Fifth Avenue parade was probably the event of the year. With close to 200 participants including 50 from Hesingue, southern Alsace, we had a great time and impact. Over 100 000 people viewed the pictures album on internet, not to mention 10,000 views of the videos related to this event!

This fall was rich with activities. Our Bureau worked hard to organise a series of events during what we called an Alsace Week between

September 18 and 27. All this started with a tribute to Albert Schweitzer at Saint George's Church (Sept 18) followed by the Alsace Pride (Sept 19), a theatrical play in Alsatian (Sept

20) and an Alsace CEO dinner (Sept 21). Thanks to donations from several Alsatian institutions and from a dozen members and friends of Alsace, we were able to secure a booth at the prestigious Best of France ex-

hibition in Times Square. As a result, tens of thousands of visitors (low estimate of 500 an hour) stopped by at our Alsace booth during those two days (26 and 27 Sept).

The year began with a lecture about Tomi Ungerer followed by a meeting between the famous Alsatian author and Bureau members of L'Union Alsacienne at the exhibition of his work that was held at the

> Drawing Center in Soho. We ended the year with two events organised at the National Arts Club thanks to member Francis Dubois, the first one focusing on the sculptor René Lalique (Oct 15) and the second one featuring the 129th birthday of the Statue of Liberty (28 Oct). Last but not least, Alsatian news in the US was marked but the first ever win of the US Open Tennis by an Alsatian player. Pierre-Hugues Herbert, born in Schiltigheim in 1991, who won the men's

## Conference on minority languages in France - June, 15th

Monday, June 15, 2015 L'Union Alsacienne et les Bretons (BZH) de New York and l'Association des Corses des États-Unis organized a conference on minority languages in France, at the headquarters of the International Organization of Francophonie, 801 Second Avenue. President Thierry Kranzer took the opportunity to introduce his latest book on this issue. The event was supported by l'Association culturelle francophone des Nations Unies, from Francoise Cestac and the Federation of French Speaking Association in America (FAFA), from Clement Mbom. The participants addressed the hot-button issue of the role — past, present, and future — of regional languages in France. Discussion centered around the politics, socio-economic impact, and perceptions of these regional languages, with a focus on dispelling popular misconceptions about the vast linguistic diversity in modern-day France. Refreshments, including Alsatian wine and Breton pastries, were served to an audience of 30 people.

L'Union Alsacienne (UnAl) is a vibrant organization of Alsatians living in the United States, and of Alsatian-Americans, dedicated to upholding the Alsatian heritage, and to promoting Alsace, the culturally germanic region of France. Alsace is also known as the birthplace of the Statue of Liberty; its sculptor Bartholdi was from Colmar. Colmar was also the home of the Zweibrücken Regiment of Strasbourg who led the final assault in Yorktown (Oct 14,1781) against last British redoubt. This region of 2 Million people is also the birthplace of ancestors of General Pershing, Actor Marlon Brando, Firestone, Astronaut Russel Schweickart, Lawrence Welk and ....Barack Obama on his mother's side (the Grunholtz left Bischwiller in 1725).

We commemorated the 140th anniversary of the birth and fithtieth of the death of this famous Alsatian who received the 1952 Nobel Peace Prize for his philosophy of "Reverence for Life", expressed in many ways, but most famously in founding and sustaining the Albert Schweitzer Hospital in Lambaréné, now in Gabon, west central Africa (then French Equatorial Africa). As a music scholar and organist, he studied the music of German composer Johann Sebastian Bach and influenced the Organ reform movement (Orgelbewegung).

Four days before, Friday 31 July he met Kent and Danielle from Castroville, The Little Alsace of Texas, whose ancestors are also named Tschirhart. Donald explained that both families are from the same village. While Donald is a descendant from a Tschirhart who left Soppe-le-Haut in the 1850's Kent is a descendant of a Tschirhart who left the same village in the 1840's. The first one reached Michigan before California, the second reached Castroville through Galveston, TX. Descendant of both Tschirharts have never met. Alsace: the Best Place to Eat in France Right Now, by Maria Helm Sinskey, in the leading luxury travel guide in the United Kingdom, October 06, 2015 www.cntraveler.com

This is quite a statement! Coming from the leading luxury travel guide in the UK, it is more than a real recognition; it's like a scientific demonstration. The author is stating that there is no better place to be in Europe this Fall than Alsace. "Alsace is having a culinary moment that's lasted for several hundred years" the magazine says before quoting Alsace native son Gabriel Kreuther, whose Alsatian-inflected cooking has won great acclaim at New York's The Modern and at his new, eponymous restaurant in Bryant Park. Sinskey writes:

"Today, the region's food—not just cabbage and charcuterie but floral honeys, rich fruit preserves, aromatic Muenster cheese, foie gras, and smoke-kissed tarte flambée—has given Alsace its currency, as have its singular wines, in particular highly coveted whites." The article mentions the 105-mile Route des Vins, tucked along the base of the Vosges mountains and cutting through half-timbered villages, fortified towns, and wine-making centers. The region really comes alive in the late Autumn, after the summer crowds have departed, when the grape harvest is nearing its end and the cabbage harvest is in full swing. Get there now, before the moment fades away!

# The Incredible story of the Alsatian pioneer of Internet technology!

The story of Jean Jacques Werner (1943 – 2000) is little-known even though he was so close. During the years 1970 to 1980, he was one of the pioneers of modern internet technologies. He studied in France and graduated from Columbia University in 1973. He joined the Bell Laboratories in Holmdel, NJ where he led an incredible team

of talented engineers who developed the system that became today's internet. He was a big fan of New York, but he always kept Alsace in its heart. It was a big surprise for the Mayor Auenheim (a small village in the northern part of Alsace, at the border of the huge Haguenau Forest), when in 2003 a delegation from Columbia University stepped into the town office asking for the authorization to add a commemorative sign at Dr. Werner's birthplace. It was a well-deserved commemoration for such a talented and discrete scientist.

### **Gabriel Kreuther**

#### opens his own place in Bryant Park

Gabriel was born on a family farm in Alsace and raised on his mother's traditional Alsatian cooking. After attending culinary school and working in Michelin-starred kitchens throughout Germany, France and Switzerland, Kreuther arrived in New York City in 1997 to work as a sous-chef at La Caravelle restaurant. A chef de cuisine position at Jean-Georges and an executive chef role at the lauded Atelier at the Ritz-Carlton followed. In 2004, Kreuther became the executive chef of Danny Meyer's The Modern, where his cooking received numerous accolades throughout his nearly decade-long tenure. A member of the Bocuse d'Or USA Culinary Council, Kreuther was named one of Food & Wine's Best New Chefs in 2003 and received a 2009 James Beard Foundation Award for "Best Chef: New York City."
